What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the AMP New Zealand Shares Fund No. 2 has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. AMP Wealth Management New Zealand Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

This is a single sector fund with exposure to New Zealand equity securities. The fund aims to achieve long term capital growth through exposure to New Zealand shares. This fund is closed to new investors.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the AMP New Zealand Shares Fund No. 2:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund’s assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Specific risk

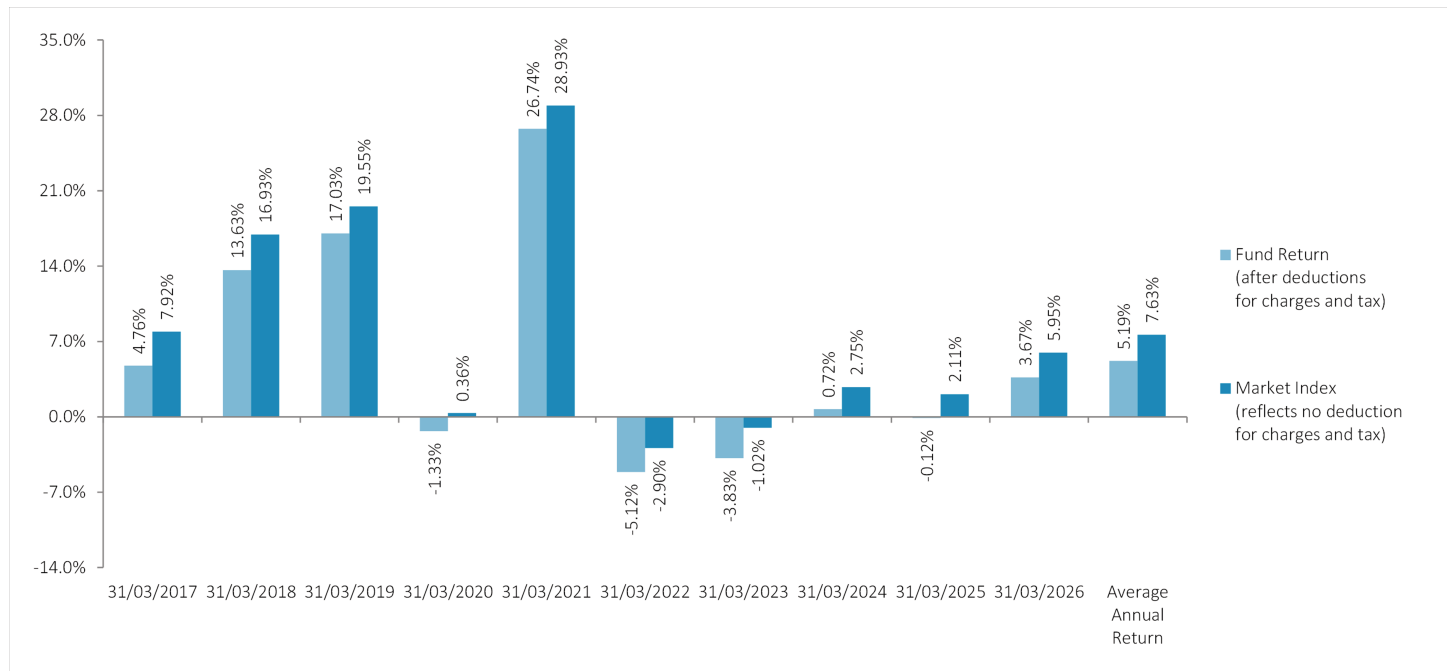
In addition to the general investment risks, you should be aware this fund is concentrated in a particular asset class and not diversified across multiple asset classes. At any given point, market conditions that cause one asset class to perform well may cause another asset class to perform poorly. This could result in negative or lower than expected returns compared to a fund which is diversified across multiple asset classes.

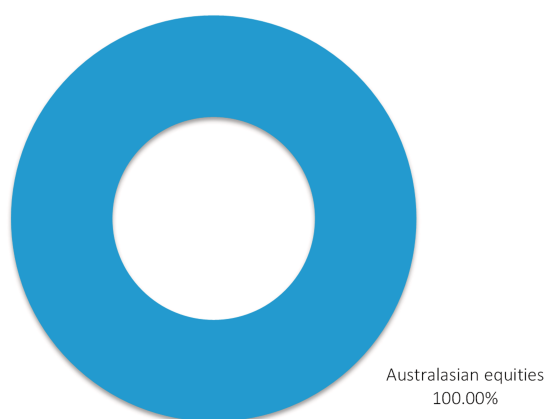
Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$367.00 (that is 3.67% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Craig a total return after tax of \$367.00 for the year.
