What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Australian Shares fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. AMP Wealth Management New Zealand Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund has a diversified portfolio of Australian equities across a range of industries and sectors. The fund aims to achieve long term capital growth through exposure to equities listed or about to list on the Australian Securities Exchange.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Australian Shares fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Specific risk

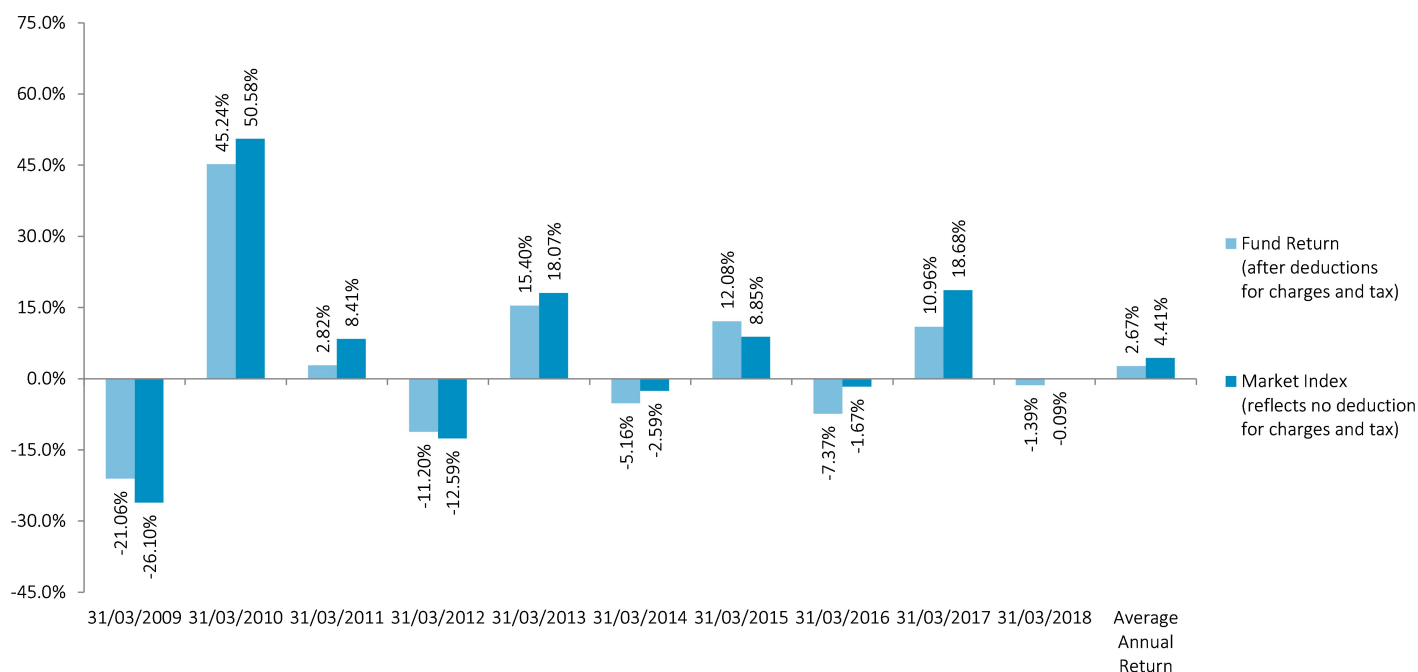
In addition to the general investment risks, you should be aware this fund is concentrated in a particular asset class and not diversified across multiple asset classes. At any given point, market conditions that cause one asset class to perform well may cause another asset class to perform poorly. 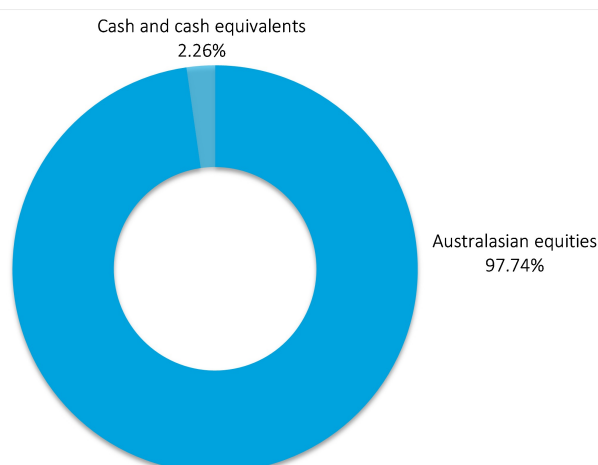
Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$139.00 (that is -1.39% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Craig a total loss after tax of \$139.00 for the year.
