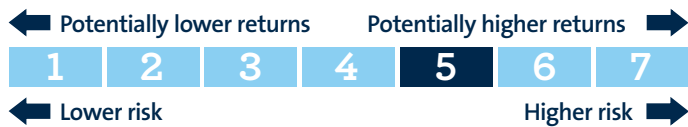
Description of this fund

The fund invests in a selection of equities issued by companies listed on share markets around the world.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the International Equity Trust:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

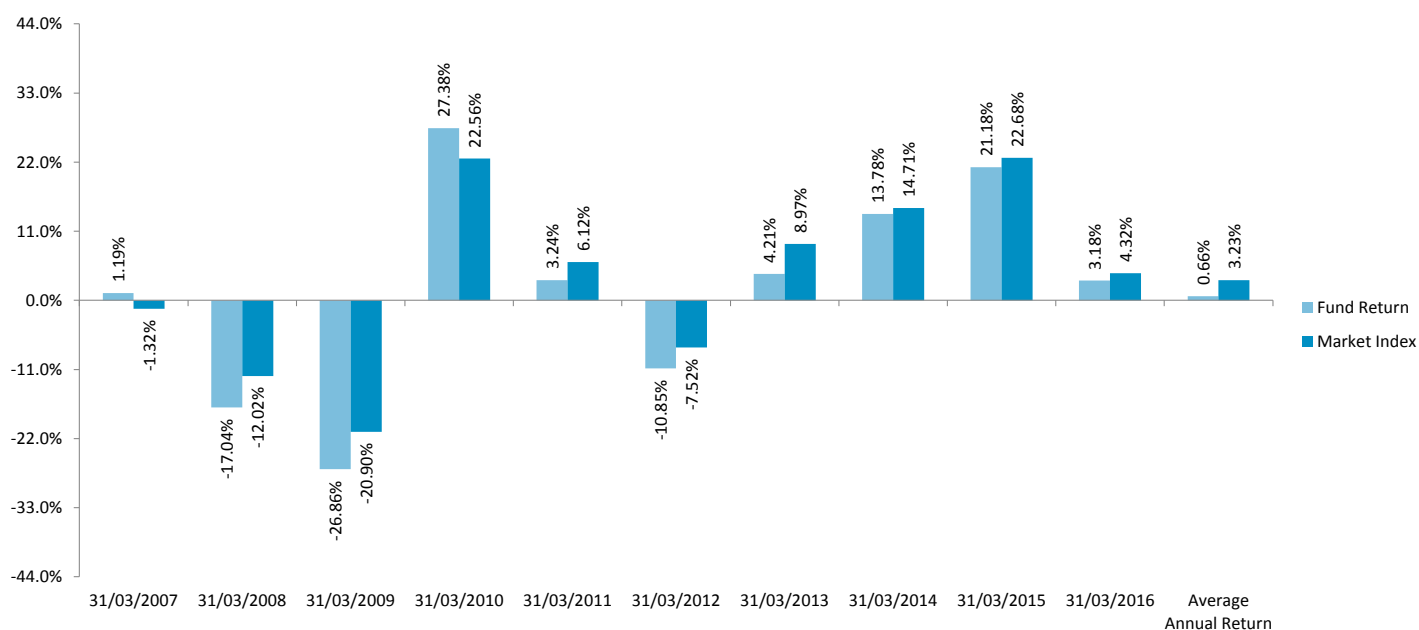
In addition to the general investment risks reflected in the fund's risk indicator, you should be aware this fund is concentrated in a particular asset class and not diversified across multiple asset classes. At any given point, market conditions that cause one asset class to do well may cause another asset class to do badly. This could result in negative or lower than expected returns compared to a fund which is diversified across multiple asset classes.

How has the fund performed?

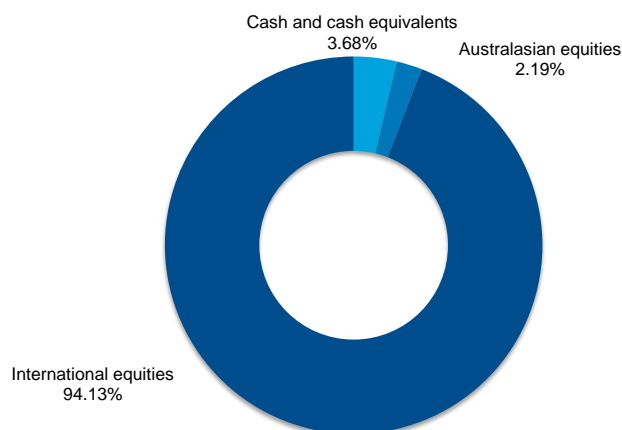
Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$196.00 (that is -1.96% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Craig a total loss after tax of \$196.00 for the year.
