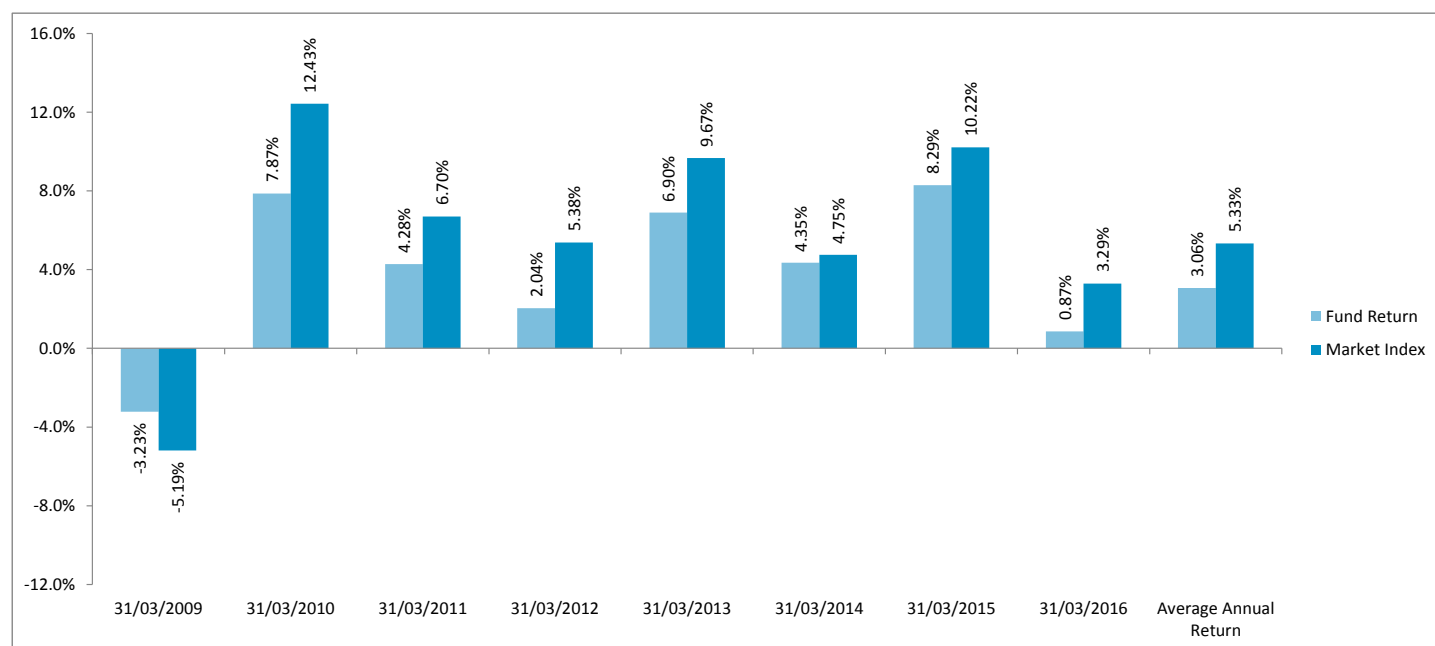




## Annual return graph



This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 30 June 2016.

**Important:** This does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.

Returns in this update are after tax at the highest prescribed investor rate (PIR) of tax for an individual New Zealand resident. Your tax may be lower.

## What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the AMP Moderate Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2016 these were:

\* Based on increased regulatory costs, including a one off cost associated with registering the AMP KiwiSaver Scheme under the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013, and increased administration expenses, the Manager estimates that the total fund charges for the next scheme year will be 1.15% of the net asset value.

Investors may also be charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds). Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

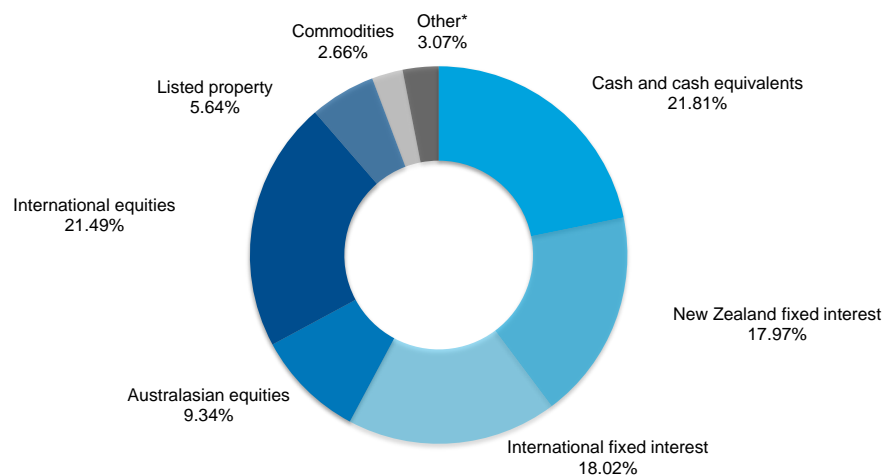
## Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$112.25 (that is 1.12% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$23.40 in other charges. This gives Craig a total return after tax of \$88.85 for the year.

## Notes

- 1 The total fund charges include administration fees that while calculated by reference to investment balances, are not allocated to specific funds. As the actual amount of the fee charged to the fund cannot be calculated, an estimate has been used. The estimate has been made by allocating the total of this fee for the funds other than the AMP Default Fund, equal to the proportion of the average net assets of the fund for the year to 31 March 2016 to the total average net assets of the funds other than the AMP Default Fund for the year to 31 March 2016.
- 2 Note that the amount of the member fee could be less if you are in an employer plan and the impact of these fees on you could be less than that set out in the example – check your Member Booklet for details.
- 3 The top ten investments and actual investment mix have been calculated excluding cash and cash equivalents held for operational purposes.
- 4 These individuals are members of the AMP Financial Services Investment Committee. The other members are Grant Hassell (Managing Director, AMP Capital New Zealand), Jeffery Darren Ruscoe (Chief Customer Officer, AMP Financial Services) and Christopher James White (Managing Director, Spicers). This Committee makes investment decisions in relation to the fund on behalf of the Manager. Members do not participate in any decisions where a conflict of interest arises.
